Create Your Own *enGAUGE It* T-shirts!

Create team spirit and help people in your community identify you and everyone who is handing out tire gauges and information cards during your *enGAUGE it* event by wearing an *enGAUGE It* t-shirt! We have a design all ready for you!

Please note that the shirt sample and template have a front and back. The back of the t-shirt gives you a chance to include the business names or logos of local sponsors if you choose to conduct local fundraising for your event or to help cover the cost of having t-shirts made.

To create your own *enGAUGE It* t-shirt with the name of your school or youth group, just follow these directions:

1. Download, or copy and paste, the [t-shirt template](#) into your own file (such as Publisher or Word). You may use just the front, or if you've gotten local sponsors, use the design template for both the front and back.
2. Insert the name of your school or youth school in bold and red Berlin Sans FB font, size 22, and make sure it is centered above the following statement:

Partnering with the Newton Marasco Foundation to get you enGAUGEd through *enGAUGE It!*

3. If you're using the back of the t-shirt to include the names and logos of any local sponsors you've received, place them underneath the "enGAUGE It sponsors" on the back. The main *enGAUGE It* corporate sponsors are included above that statement.

To have your *enGAUGE It* t-shirts made, follow these steps (start about six weeks before your event):

1. Determine how many t-shirts you'll need.
2. Identify local companies that print t-shirts.
3. Present them with your *enGAUGE It* program, and explain that you'd like to have these t-shirt made for your event (be sure to have the design with you to show them).
4. Ask for an estimate, and if the company would be willing to donate all or a portion of the printing for your *enGAUGE It* program.
5. After you select the company you'll use, find out how long it will take to have the t-shirts printed so you'll have them in time for your event.
6. To help pay for the t-shirts, consider asking local businesses to be a sponsor and include their logos on the back, and also consider selling them to those participating in your event, to others in your school or youth group, and even to people who come to your event!

Then, wear them proudly!
